#### **Media Center - What Is It?**

- · Alternate User Interface to Vista
  - Only on Vista Home Premium / Ultimate
- Evolved from Windows XP Media Center Edition
- · Can co-exist with the Windows Vista Desktop
  - Run it as a regular window or full screen
  - Features Large Characters and icons
- · Can support a remote control
  - "10 foot user interface" (for TVs)
- · Primarily Oriented to Multi-media Activities
- Takes Some Getting used To
- Most MC features also accessible from Start Menu

Windows Vista - Media Center

#### **Hardware Requirements**

- Media Center Requires Full Support for Aero Glass
- Minimum Requirements for Aero Glass
  - 1 GHz P4 CPU., 1 GB of RAM
  - DirectX 9 Graphics Card with WDDM driver, Pixel Shader 2, 32 bits / pixel (for Aero glass UI)
  - 15 GB free hard disk space on a 40GB drive
- Tom's Recommended Requirements for Media Center
  - 1.8 GHz P4 CPU., 2 GB of RAM
  - DirectX 9 Graphics Card with WDDM driver, Pixel Shader 2, 32 bits / pixel (for Aero glass UI)
  - 100 GB free hard disk space on a 200GB drive

#### **Demo of Media Center Desktop**

- · Designed for use with a remote control
  - Vertical arrows to move between major functions
  - Horizontal arrows to move between sub-functions
  - Click to select a specific function
  - Click "go back" arrow at upper left to go back a level
  - Click round Windows icon to go full screen
- · For TV viewing and recording, you need a TV Tuner
  - Internal PCI card or external USB tuner device
- Functions in Media Center similar to Vista Programs:
  - Media Player, Movie Maker, Photo Gallery

# **Media Center Pictures**

- · Automatically locates pictures for library
- · Can play slide shows
- · Can play music in background
- · Browse around by different attributes:
  - Date taken, Tags, Folders, ...
- Can adjust settings for slide shows
  - Speed, transitions, panning

# **Media Center Music**

- Organize and view your library
  - Artisit, Album, Genre, Song List
- Play single songs
- Queue up songs (now playing)
- Save the Queue as a Play List
- Delete Songs
- Edit song information
- Buy music
- Burn music to CDs
- Turn on visualizations

# **Media Center Videos and Movies**

- · Part of Pictures and Movies area
- Video Library
  - Similar to picture & music library
  - Recognizes various video file formats
- Various Views
  - Video name, Date taken
- Online Media
  - Streaming video from the Internet
  - Seems to be mostly pay

# **TV Tuning and Recording**

- · Requires a TV tuner card or external USB tuner
- Can set up Media Center to know channels, preferences
- · Basically lets you use your PC as a TV
- · Need an antenna or cable feed
- Most likely won't work well with DirecTV or Dish

Windows Vista - Media Center

#### **CD and DVD Burning**

- Media Center has a "burn" function
- · Offers "contextually relevant" burn choices
  - Depends on type of blank media in drive
  - Data CD / DVD
  - Music (Audio) CD
- To burn Video DVDs, you must first insert a blank DVD
  - DVD+R, DVD-R, DVD+RW, DVD-RW
- Apparently, no choice for MP3 CDs or DVDs

#### **Assorted Tasks**

- Media Center lets you do some basic computer management functions.
- · Choose the Tasks function
  - You can shutdown your PC.
  - You can Restart your PC.
  - You can sleep your PC.
  - You can log off your PC
  - You can burn CDs and DVDs
  - You can sync to/from your external device.
  - You can adjust settings for the Media Center.
